

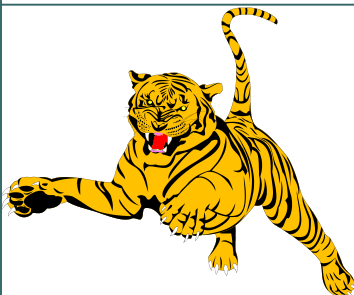

The temperature in July and August unmistakably said summer and no matter how you felt about it, we hope that you took advantage of spending time with family and friends and are ready for the challenges, light hearted moment and memories of the upcoming year.

There is so much happening in our community, the students have been involved in sports since long, one of many Guidance Nights took place, there was the orientation of Transfer Students and whether it's your first time in the school or you're a veteran, we hope you took advantage of Open House which was held on September 15th. With regard to PTA, we are steadfast in our mission to provide support for parents, teachers and students. However, as our kids move from Elementary to Middle School to High School, and become progressively more independent, we find that our parental involvement decreases as well. While our kids may not "need" us as much, their school support system, which includes the PTA and all that it can afford, is still

as much a support system for them as our Principal, Teachers, Guidance Counselors, Administrative Staff, Coaches, District Leaders and other Mentors. 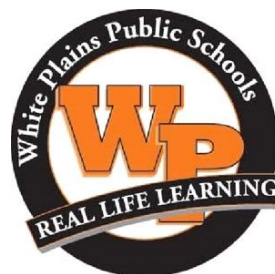

year, 6th VP Recognition - we currently have two(2) well-seasoned parents for this position, but we need another parent as backup. Hospitality Chair – to assist the 7th VP Hospitality and a hopefully take over the position in the following year, 8th Grade Orientation and Chair – all positions are important, but we really need a representative to help for when new student (s) transitions.

Fundraising: The fundraising events are literally the bread and butter of the PTA for funding events for our Students and providing grants to Teachers. Last year we were only able to provide Teacher Grants of \$5,731 and Scholarship to Students of \$17,700. We would like to increase these amounts by at least twenty percent (20%). Fundraisers for this school year include

With your support, look how much we were able to accomplish! Under the leadership of past Presidents Sandra Alexandrou & Rhonda Herman:

Student Recognition We awarded a total of \$17,700 to 59 students; each receiving \$300. This award was given to graduating Seniors who were continuing their education either through College or pursuing a Trade. These students also showed their commitment to our community with 30 hours of community service (in addition to any hours that would have been required by the National Honor Society) and provided a 250 word essay on the importance of Community

Teacher Grants

1. \$1000 given to teachers Wendy Dale and Imani Bolling, to be used to pay 35 - 40 students, representing various high school clubs, to attend a two day workshop at the

Taconic Outdoor Education Center. The students will be trained to understand the roots of racism and the means of eliminating racism in our school and community. the students will then share their knowledge and experience with other members of their respective clubs.

2. \$200 given to teacher Michael Chiariello to be used to purchase membership to the Katonah Museum of Art for approximately 55 - 60 ninth through twelfth grade students in the National Honor Society. This membership affords the students unlimited access to the museum throughout the academic year. The students will be eligible to participate in the prestigious annual country-wide high school art exhibition

3. \$1000 provided towards the cost of paying for Shaun Derik, a motivational speaker. This was coordinated along with the Youth Bureau that contributed \$300. Mr. Derik provided three presentations in the first quarter of 2015. He presented to all Rochambeau students, the 9th graders at the high school, and the 8th graders at Highlands. The purpose of this presentation was to motivate youth to achieve their highest potential and not allow barriers like drugs, alcohol, and other negative behaviors get in the way of achieving their goals.

4. \$750 provided towards the cost of paying for Mark Sterner. Mr. Sterner will present to the 11th and 12th graders. Mr. Sterner was involved in a DUI that resulted in the deaths of three individuals. The White Plains Library, via a grant from Allstate, contributed \$750 towards the cost of the presentation. This presentation is scheduled for Wednesday, December 10th.

5. \$1,350 provided for the implementation of an acrylic coral reef tank in the Marine Science classroom to Mr. Erik Larson. The coral reef tank allows Mr. Larson to teach aquarist skills, topics on salinity, temperature and water density not only in real time, but with actual examples. Not only are hands on learning experiences valuable to our students, but this equipment benefits at least 60 students to those in Mr. Larson's class, is available for use by all WPHS students, all science teachers and may be of interest to the Living Environment teachers and their students.

6. \$136 at the request of Ms. Rebecca Fahey and Samantha Gerhardt for The Service Learning Class for a trip to the 9/11 Memorial in New York City. This grant would ben-

efit to teach about memorials and the impact on a society and on the government/economic side shows how memorials are built, who funds them and the role of government pertaining to same

7. \$500 for the Criminal Law, American Jurisprudence and Forensics class for a speaker, Mr. Alan Newton, a wrongfully convicted individual, to provide a real life experience and understanding of how the criminal justice system works, mistakes that can occur and how these events affect lives and its remedy. Not only will Mr. Newton's experience provide insight, but they will learn about the processes in place to protect defendants, gain an understanding of the mechanisms of the criminal justice system, but be a vehicle for each student to review and illustrate key concepts and practices while teaching about the 4th, 5th and 6th Amendments of the United States Constitution.

8. \$396 for Ms. Jennifer DeGraphenreed to take her Science Fiction in Literature and Film class to see Star Wars at the City Center in White Plains. It's not just a movie folks, according to Ms. DeGraphenreed, "Some of the greatest film making technologies have been produced while making Science Fiction films." This film will also help to show the advancements in film making which resulted from this genre

9. \$500 for Ms. Stacey Podolsky Hebert to bring in a speaker, an individual who was wrongfully incarcerated and with the help of the Innocence Project, was recently exonerated, to speak with Rochambeau students. These students, many of whom are enrolled in Criminal Law, Biology (Living Environment) and Forensics, will get to review what DNA is, its uses in criminal investigations and the legalities of physical and eyewitness evidence. This grant will benefit 120 students and 20 staff members.

We realize that schedules are tight and we're pulled in several directions from all the facets of our lives, but try to come to at least one (1) meeting this year. The dates are posted on the school calendar and PTA websites. Additionally, the school make call outs ahead of the meetings to remind parents. If you have a topic you would like us to address, please drop us an email or give us a call.
